

## CARE AND MAINTENANCE

J-Kraft, Inc.'s products meet or exceed the Architectural Woodwork Institute's standards for cabinetry and finish. The satin finish protects the wood and enhances its natural beauty. The following are guidelines about the characteristics and care of wood cabinetry.

- Cabinets have been finished with a top coat that resists foods, beverages, and household agents typically found in the kitchen or bath. However, from time to time, the cabinets will need regular cleaning and care.
- Wipe with a clean, soft, damp cloth and dry immediately. Never use a dishcloth or sponge that might contain remnants of detergent or grease. To remove food residue or grease, use any common dishwashing liquid—not detergent—or solution of mild soap and water. Wipe with a clean damp cloth and dry thoroughly. If a spill occurs, clean and dry immediately. Left unattended, a spill can soak through the wood surface and cause damage.
- Do not use soap pads, steel wool, or cleaners that contain bleach, ammonia, or abrasives. These agents may cause discoloration, marring, or dulling of the finish. Do not wax or polish cabinet surfaces. Wax build-up will leave a residue that is difficult to remove. The extensive use of wax or silicone polishes can result in a film build-up which may destroy the cabinet's finish and void the warranty.
- Excess moisture can damage the cabinet finish. Clean spills, water, or moisture from cabinets immediately. Give special attention to areas around the sink and dishwasher. Avoid draping damp or wet dishcloths over the door of the sink base cabinet. Over time, this moisture can cause permanent damage to your cabinet finish. Water damage to cabinets is not covered under warranty.
- When possible, keep cabinets out of direct sunlight or close curtains during the sunniest part of the day. Direct sunlight will cause cabinets to lighten or darken overtime. Try to avoid exposing cabinets to very hot and cold environments. Long term exposure to extreme temperatures and/or moisture can cause wood to expand and contract, eventually damaging the finish.

## CHARACTERISTICS

Natural variations in the wood will be present throughout your kitchen and bath cabinets, resulting in unique character markings on adjacent cabinets, on pairs of doors, and even within the same panel. We point out these unique characteristics of our cabinets as a reminder that each piece of wood is different and the varied effect of finished cabinetry in a complete kitchen or bath may be different from that represented by a smaller sample or display. The variations can be broad; J-Kraft, Inc. is not responsible for the type or degree of variation in your cabinetry.

## LIMITED WARRANTY

This limited warranty extends exclusively to the original purchaser of the warranted product. Others, including subsequent purchasers, are not covered by this limited warranty. Installed cabinets are warranted against defects in materials or workmanship for one year from the date of closing.

Final determination on warranty-related items rests solely with J-Kraft, Inc. In the event of a defect due to materials or workmanship, J-Kraft, Inc. will repair or replace the product.
